learning for all ages

»»» nursery

Professional-led and member-supported childcare for babies, toddlers, and children up to 5 years old is available every Sunday. Activities include drawing, painting, reading, and creative free play. We welcome your whole family to participate fully in church on Sunday morning.

»»» elementary & middle school

The winter/spring program is as needed and responds to the spiritual interests and needs of the children and youth present. Activities include reflection, spiritual practices, and play. Sessions connect to the worship service through the *Tapestry of Faith* curriculum, a bold lifespan UU learning resource.

»»» teens and adults

Teens 15 and over are welcome at all adult religious education programs. Sign up for a short workshop, explore our extensive library in the office for resources on theological and practical topics from Unitarian Universalist and diverse religious perspectives. One-day programs will also be announced closer to the date they convene.

WINTER/SPRING OFFERINGS

program descriptions

»»» Social Arts

Beth Beyers convenes 7 sessions of finding profound experiences in being together through art. The primary art form practiced will be the art of conversation. Additional practices may include social painting, clay sculpture, weaving, movement, singing, poetry, and playback theatre. The art form is the vehicle for building intimacy rather than a craft to be perfected.

»»» On Repentance and Repair Dialogue

Laurel Zeri facilitates a 4-week discussion of the 2023–2024 UUA Common Read, *On Repentance and Repair: Making Amends in an Unapologetic World* by Dayna Ruttenberg. This book offers a glimpse into one of our faith's foundational sources, Judaism. Readers explore the call to accountability as we follow Rabbi Ruttenberg into a framework for making amends offered by the 12th century Jewish physician and scholar, Maimonides. Explore practices for accountability that can bring us into wholeness and really make a difference in our personal, community, and national relationships.

»»» Movies for Change

A Dialogue on Race and Ethnicity (ADORE) presents monthly movies and discussions on the themes of race, ethnicity, systemic oppression, and social justice. Movies, dates, and viewing times will be announced in the weekly newsletter.
